This September, I will be entering Integrated Engineering at Western University. I've wanted to be an engineer for many years and I am humbled by being selected as the John Evans Scholarship Award winner. Being awarded this scholarship provides me with further encouragement as I take on the challenges ahead. Additionally, this scholarship will give me significant financial support which will help me focus on extending my community outreach into my first year of school.

I am also a member of the Junior Optimist Organization, where I placed first in both the Oratorical and Essay contests in 2022.
