The Canadian Engineering Memorial Foundation (CEMF) is proud to announce the results of the 2023 Scholarship Program.

CEMF has been promoting self-identifying women in engineering through scholarship, outreach, and career opportunities since 1990, in memory of the 14 women killed at École Polytechnique in 1989.

Scholarship recipients are selected based on community service, extracurricular activities, leadership, and a demonstrated commitment to promoting a career in engineering to the next generation. Each scholarship recipient becomes an ambassador, connecting with students at the junior and high school levels through an in-person classroom presentation that they write and design. All presentations are geared to inspiring young minds to visualize themselves as future engineers.
